Reflections on the Theme

The 2021 Association Theme is "One District on One Accord" Acts of the Apostles 2:1-3

WMU Theme: "Christian Women Working Together on God's Mission on One Accord" Acts of the Apostles 1:14; 2:1-3

As we look at our 2021 WMU Theme "Christian Women, Working Together, on God's Mission, on One Accord", we acknowledge that to be on one accord means to be doing things together in agreement and likeness of mind. As we look to the scriptures, we find the same purpose and the likeness of mind exemplified in the lives of the 12 men who Jesus chose to be his disciples and the women that the Bible records, followed Jesus and supported His ministry. As we reflect on our theme, let's breakdown each component to learn more about these amazing women in the Bible who followed Jesus' ministry on one accord.

Christian Women

Luke 8:1-3, records the names and status of the women who followed Jesus with likeness of mind. Most of the women had followed and supported Jesus from the beginning of his Ministry. Many times, they followed along with the disciples. Jesus had healed some of the women, some were financially able to support Jesus' ministry and they all believed he was the Son of God.

These women followed Jesus to his crucifixion and watched with his Mother Mary until his body was taken down from the cross and placed in the tomb. *Mark 15:40-41, records, "Some women were watching from a distance, including Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of James the less and Joses, and Salome.*

Working Together

These women joined together to go to the tomb on the first day of the week to anoint Jesus' body which was the Jewish tradition. They were working together to support and lift each other up during this extremely sorrowful time. Luke 24:1, records, "On the first day of the week, very early in the morning, the women took the spices they had prepared and went to the tomb."

These women saw and heard the angels who were sitting in the tomb after Jesus' resurrection. Luke 24:4b-6a records," suddenly two men in clothes that gleamed like lightning stood beside them. In their fright the women bowed down with their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here; he has risen!"

Also, these same women were the first to see Jesus after His resurrection and the first to speak to the Risen Savior. John 20:16 records, "Jesus said to her, "Mary." She turned toward him and cried out in Aramaic, "Rabboni!" (which means "Teacher")."

On God's Mission

These women were told by the two angels to go tell Jesus' disciples to meet him in Galilee, this made them the first to proclaim to the disciples that, "Jesus has risen as He said." Matthew 28:7 records," And go quickly, and tell his disciples that he is risen from the dead; and, behold, he goeth before you into Galilee; there shall ye see him: ". Mary Magdalene ran to tell the disciples.

On One Accord

In the Acts of the Apostles, Chapter 1, Luke records these same women gathered in the Upper Room with the eleven disciples to pray after Jesus ascended into heaven. Acts 1:14 records, "they all continued with one accord in prayer, and supplication or earnestly asking as they were waiting on the Holy Spirit to empower them for the work, Jesus left for them to carry out in the Great Commission.

Acts 2: 3-4 records, "When the Holy Spirit came on the Day of Pentecost, they were all together in one place. Suddenly a sound like the blowing of a violent wind came from heaven and filled the whole house where they were sitting. They saw what seemed to be tongues of fire that separated and came to rest on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Those who were gathered said, "we hear them declaring the wonders and message of God in our own tongues!" The power of the Holy Spirit caused all gathered, to hear the same message, at the same time, in the same place, in their own language.

Once the disciples of Jesus Christ received the power of the Holy Spirit, they were ready to go do the work Jesus commissioned them to do. After the Holy Spirit came:

They had the power to be witnesses - Acts 1:8; "But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judaea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth."

They had the power to fulfil the Great Commission recorded in Matt. 28:19-20 as, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world." Amen.

They had the power to carry out the ministry of love to help meet the physical needs of their fellowmen as record in Matt. 25:35-40, "For I was an hungered, and ye gave me meat: I was thirsty, and ye gave me drink: I was a stranger, and ye took me in: Naked, and ye clothed me: I was sick, and ye visited me: I was in prison, and ye came unto me."

Just as the disciples and the women who followed Jesus, we too have been empowered and equipped for His Mission. We are like the 12 disciples and the women who followed Jesus, because he has called us, too. We are his disciples and we his work must do.

- We are **Christian Women**, because we believe in Jesus Christ as our redeemer and the only way to the Father;
- We are **Working Together**, because we have aligned ourselves in our NED WMU to share our resources, time, money, talents, and continuous prayers to promote and complete God's Mission. We are to Go, teach and plant the word of God in the hearts of all mankind to make more disciples.
- We are **on God's Mission** to redeem the world and restore all mankind back to the Father. We must tell all men, women, boys and girls the Gospel Message that, Jesus is the only way to Salvation. Jesus tells us in John 14:6, "I am the way, the truth, and the life: no man cometh unto the Father, but by me."
- We are on **One Accord**, because we have the same likeness of mind to work together with the power that the Holy Spirit has given us for the good of our churches, and this District. We must be supportive of each ministry and happy to be about the work of kingdom building for the Savior.

If we are to meet the spiritual and physical needs of all mankind, we must be on one accord, praying, with supplication. No big I and little you. Just fellow believers who are willing to reach and evangelize the masses by lifting up the name of Jesus. In John 12:32, Jesus said," And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me."

In a world and time where there is so little likeness of mind, so little love and concern for each other we need to Lift Up Jesus, so we can have His peace on earth. The peace that was meant to be. Jesus has given us the power through the Holy Spirit to Go, witness and lift up his name and he promised that he would do the drawing. There is an old familiar Gospel Hymn written by Johnson Oatman Jr., which tells about the role of the church in making known the message of our Savior who was lifted up from the earth to draw all men unto Him. The words say,

- 1) How to reach the masses, men of every birth, For an answer, Jesus gave the key: "And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, Will draw all men unto Me."
- 2) Oh! the world is hungry for the Living Bread, Lift the Savior up for them to see; Trust Him, and do not doubt the words that He said, "I'll draw all men unto Me."
- 3) Lift Him up by living as a Christian ought, Let the world in you the Savior see; Then men will gladly follow Him Who once taught, "I'll draw all men unto me."

Chorus: Lift Him up, Lift Him up, Still, He speaks from eternity: And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, Will draw all men unto Me."

Now, more than ever, it is our time to continue to carry out the Great Commission and proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ to the uttermost parts of the world. The Women's Missionary Union of New Era Baptist District Association are committed to lifting up the name of Jesus, everywhere we go and in everything that we do, until Jesus returns to take us to God our Father.

We are united with the same likeness of mind, as the women who served and followed Jesus to the completion of his earthly Mission. We have heard of the Master's men, well, we are the Master's women. We are **Christian Women Working Together on God's Mission on One Accord.**
